HOPE

Part 2

51 - Ephesians: Rise Up & Walk Church on the Park Live | Resurrection Sunday, 12 April 2020

Text: "Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (Rom. 15:13, NASB).

Theme: You were created to live with abundant hope.

Intro: Recently, my wife, Anna, planted three very small Frangipane cuttings in our front garden. She planted them with the hope that one day these Frangipane cuttings would grow into a beautiful sheltered garden area. Seeds give us hope. The planter of the seed has a vision that the future will be better because the seed will grow. Seeds change the future and they make the world a better place.

1) You were created to have abundant hope (Rom. 15:13).

- · You were created to abound in hope.
- · Why?
 - · Because the God who created you is the God of hope.
 - Even **before** God created, he knew the **destruction** we would bring to earth because of our **sin**.
 - God still created because he was filled with hope.
 - The Lord had a plan and a purpose and it all had to do with a seed.
- According to the Bible, hope is not merely wishful thinking.
 - Instead, it's a confident expectation of God's goodness in your present and future.
 - Life is like a **game of chess**. You may lose some pieces, but if you have great foresight, you will be able to win the game. And God is the great **chess master**.
 - God knew that **whatever** the enemy threw at him, **his grace** would be **greater** than sin and evil.
- Hope is the key to living in the fullness of joy and peace.
 - · Listen to Romans 15:13 again.
 - "Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (Rom. 15:13, NASB).
 - How is this possible to **abound** in hope?
 - By **faith** which connects you to the power of the Holy Spirit.

2) The Father chose to revolutionise the world—with all its sin, pain and suffering—through a seed (Gal. 3:16).

- "Now the promises were spoken to Abraham and to his seed. He does not say, 'And to seeds,' as referring to many, but rather to one, 'And to **your seed,' that is, Christ**. (Gal. 3:16, NASB; cf. Gal. 3:19)
 - In Galatians, Paul describes Jesus as the seed.
 - · He is Abraham's seed, but more than that, he is the heavenly Father's seed.
- What were the precious promises God spoke to Abraham around 4000 years ago and 2000 years before Jesus came?
 - God's promises to Abraham and his seed were to: 1) Be his God, 2) Be with him, 3) Bless him and 4) Make him a blessing to the nations.
 - These are promises of great hope.
 - This is the **heart of God's covenant**: 1) a **Personal Relationship** with God, 2) the **Presence** of God, 3) the **Power** of God and 4) the **Promises** of God flowing through you to others.
 - We worship the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. This is the God who speaks and reveals himself to his people. This is the God who walks with us and rescues us.

This is the God who **makes something out of nothing**. This is the God who **turns the curse into a blessing**.

3) The Father's seed is the key to abounding in hope (Matt. 3:16-17; John 12:24).

- I love **gardens**. I'm preparing this message in our backyard garden. I made myself a little cafe with a table, chairs and coffee.
 - I love the Brisbane Botanical Gardens, which I miss. And my favourite place is the Bayard Cutting Arboretum in Long Island, New York.
- I love gardens because they **remind me of Jesus**, who is the **seed of the Father.**
 - Let's look **deeper** at the **SEED**. [Pull out the avocado seed]
- 1 First, Jesus was SELECTED.
 - The Father selected his Son as the Seed that would revolutionise the world.
 - The Father selected his Son as the Seed before the world began.
 - From eternity, the Father selected his seed. He held it in his hand and cherished it. He prophesied about it through Old Testament history. He revealed it in stories, songs, events, people and oracles. For those who have eyes to see it, every page of the Hebrew Bible speaks about this precious seed the Father had chosen.
 - The Father **selected** his Son as the Seed **because** he knew his Son would be **completely loyal and obedient to him**.
 - We have hope today because of **Christ's obedience** to his Father.
 - That's the 'O' in our HOPE acrostic: Obedience or Obey.
- 2 Second, Jesus was EXHIBITED by the Father for the world to see.
 - The Father **held** this seed in his hand, waiting till the **perfect time** to sow it into the world. He spent **four thousand years preparing the soil of humanity** to receive the seed. Even with all that preparation, some of his people fought against him. But the good news is that there was a **remnant** that received this **perfect and pure seed of his Son.**
 - When the Father exhibited his Son to the world he told the world how pleased he was of his Son.
 - Listen to the Father: "This is my beloved Son in whom I am so pleased" (Matt. 3:17).
 - The Father was so please because of the Son's love, devotion, humility and obedience.
 - Jesus was sinless—perfectly righteous and holy—no blemish was found in God's lamb.
 - This is why the Father's seed has so much power.
 - The **power** was because of its **purity**.
 - · It was God's incorruptible seed.
- 3 Third, Jesus was ENSHROUDED and ENTOMBED through crucifixion.
 - The avocado stone the stone that the builders rejected
 - After the Father exhibited his seed to the world he sowed his seed into the ground.
 - The Father's seed was enshrouded and entombed through crucifixion and burial.
 - And it was no coincidence that Jesus was enshrouded and entombed in a garden.
 - Also, a large stone kept him locked in to his tomb.
 - When Jesus was buried in the ground (so to speak), his roots began to grow underneath the surface.
 - He was hidden and buried—but this was not the end of the story.
 - **Jesus** went **to the cross** because he was **full of hope**. He shared this hope with his disciples throughout his ministry, but they couldn't understand it. The idea of a physical resurrection after a cruel and gruelling crucifixion was totally foreign to them.
 - "Truly, truly, I say to you, **unless a grain of wheat falls** into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit (John 12:24).
- 4 Fourth and last, Jesus was DELIVERED from DEATH through resurrection.
 - The seed that was planted and lost to the eye, rose again.
 - The seed sprouted in resurrection life.
 - The **stone** that blocked the tomb supernaturally rolled away and **Jesus walked out** victorious over sin, death and the devil's schemes (Luke 24:1-12).

- The resurrection of Jesus means victory over everything that spoiled the garden of God's creation.
 - The resurrection means victory over sin, sickness and shame.
- And soon it began to bear fruit in Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria and now throughout the world.

4) Let the Father plant the seed of Christ in your heart (James 1:21).

- The Father has already planted the seed of Christ in the world...
 - But have you let the Father plant the seed of Christ in your heart.
- This seed planted in you will be the beginning of new life and abounding in hope.
- Again listen to Romans 15:13.
 - Who is the Holy Spirit?
 - He is the presence of the Almighty God who has come to live and breath inside of you. He is the God who is with you—if you will receive him.
 - God knows the end from the beginning. He knows that all things will be completed in him. He knows there will be a new heaven and a new earth. He knows that even now, you can taste the powers of the age to come.
- When the Holy Spirit is living and breathing within you, God's hope becomes your hope.

Conclusion: The Father's seed was chosen to revolutionise the world—and your life as well. God selected this seed—Jesus Christ—and wants to sow it into your heart. Will you let him? The Father's seed is the beginning of true hope.
